On a mission to eradicate hunger among the needy. Food For All **Chennai** was created in **June 19th** - **August 2018** by a group of friends. Later, it evolved into a **Chennai**-based youth volunteer organization that contributes to society's wellbeing. The organization has served **1,00,000 Meals** so far. This youth volunteer organization has helped numerous **single parent families with schooling, employment, providing provisions, medical ailments, and constructing toilets and houses** during natural disasters, in addition to providing food for the needy. On the year of 2021, we choose to focus on and address key issues about women's empowerment, called the **PINK MISSION**, and believe that by bringing in more collaborators, they can help boost a growing community.

WASTAGE OF FOOD ACROSS THE GLOBE WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO INDIA PARTICULARLY TAMIL NADU. WHAT ARE THE MEASURES TAKEN AND WHAT CAN BE IMPLEMENTED.

Global food waste is a cross-cutting issue that starts during agricultural production and continues all of the way to the landfill. Over 30% of food is lost or wasted each year. This number is even more striking, given the large number of hungry people in the world. Wasted food is not only inefficient, it's a social justice issue.

Global food waste has an enormous environmental impact, too. Food waste is a huge source of greenhouse gas (GHC) emissions and wasted natural resources, and therefore –reducing food waste could help to reduce global greenhouse gas emissions, establish food security, and encourage healthy food systems. When we talk about food waste, we may think of the food we throw away after cooking meals, or the uneaten food from our tables at fine dining establishments. However, the sources of food waste are far more varied than this. Food waste includes lost or discarded food at all stages of the food system. Here are some important definitions related to food waste.

Food waste: Definition

The term **"wasted food"** refers to any food that is not used for its intended use and must be **"managed." "Wasted food"** is the term used by the US EPA instead of **"food waste"** to express the value that can be recovered through alternative uses. Wasted food comes from a wide variety of sources: unsold food from local markets or other retail outlets such as produce food from restaurants, prepared edible food that has not eaten trimmings like food scraps from food preparation in restaurants, cafeterias, or homes, and by-product processing.

The difference between Food waste and food loss

There are a few different categories under the umbrella of wasted food. **"Food loss"** refers to uneaten agricultural, forestry, and fishery products. It occurs during the food production and distribution stage. It is also caused by either a reduction in the quantity or quality of food.

This may occur due to various reasons. For instance, there may be disruptions in the supply chain due to fluctuating supply and demand or spoilage due to adverse weather conditions.

"Food waste," on the other hand, refers to edible food that is intended for human consumption, but instead gets discarded or expires. This can occur in many different situations during preparation, sales, or food service. It includes plate waste, spoiled food, and discarded peels and rinds. Rich countries waste the most, as do industrialized countries – who often have a significant impact on this food loss and waste.

"Food loss and waste" is a term used to define the sum of both types of inefficiencies from unused food in the food system. This term helps researchers clearly explain the scope of their studies.

Global waste: Over a third of all food produced (~2.5 billion tons) is lost or wasted each year. One third of this occurs in the food production stage. Boston consulting group (BCG) estimates this wasted food is worth **\$230 billion**.

Researchers estimate the lost food calories from food waste amount to roughly **24%** of the total available food calories. To put this in perspective, the UN reports that about a third of the global population, mostly in developing countries and low income countries, didn't have enough access to food in **2020**–an increase of **320** million people from the previous year. The trend is increasing, too. The level of food wasted globally is expected to rise by another third by **2030**.

Problem of Food waste: Food waste may seem harmless as a biodegradable substance. Yet, when it rots, it releases methane emissions into the atmosphere without proper management. Understanding the consequences of food waste can help us better address the problem. In **2013**, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) estimated that **1.3 gigatons** of edible food is wasted each year, and this releases **3.3 gigatons** of CO2 equivalent. This estimate doesn't include land use change, either, which would put the figure even higher.

Research compiled by Our World in Data estimates that food waste accounts for about **6%** of the world's total emissions comes from food waste. Of this, about **2/3s** is from food losses, while the remaining **1/3** is from food waste.

The main causes of food waste: There are some unexpected causes for the food that gets wasted. It's understandable that people don't finish large portions of food at restaurants on a retail and consumer level, but some of the less obvious reasons for food waste relate to agricultural processes, food safety standards, and consumer preferences.

Perhaps you recall the reports of Kenyan farmers losing their crops to locusts in **2020.** The last time they swarmed at such a level in **2003-2005,** it resulted in crop damage of **\$2.5** billion. Locusts are mainly killed by pest infestations, so improving access to pesticides is one way to reduce food loss and help smallholder farmers.

Apart from natural causes, personal preferences also contribute to wasted food. Research shows that produce buyers avoid **"ugly produce."** A fifth of edible produce that has surface blemishes, grows in unfamiliar shapes, or has unique coloration gets discarded from grocery stores. This means that high income countries are contributing to food waste in earlier stages at a retail level, and that food and agriculture organization cannot mitigate this food loss.

Climate change also contributes to food losses and lack of food security. It makes growing and harvesting cycles less predictable. Non seasonal frost, early spring, and a range of other climatic shifts are significantly impacting both the prices farmers set for their crops as well as their ability to predict the right time to plant and harvest. Product may prematurely spoil due to delayed transport, orders, or poor storage facilities availability. These are just a few of many wide-ranging reasons food loss and waste occurs.

Sustainable management of food: Sustainable food management reduces the unfortunate waste and losses in the food system. Careful planning and coordination between governments, food producers, sellers, and consumers can reduce the food waste dilemma.

In fact, one of the biggest challenges is the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal to have per capita global food waste at the retail and consumer levels by **2030**. This will ultimately help low income countries, supply chains, chronic poverty, and reduce the amount of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere. The sustainable management of food takes a bird's eye view to avoid the knock on effects of waste in the food system.

Food waste can occur at each stage, whether it's from the overuse of natural resources or unsold produce. The sustainable management of food can reduce costs for food purchasers and consumers, while bridging the needs of food-poor communities and unused food resources. Even though governments are often key players in the sustainable management of food, businesses and consumers have an important role to play as well. Here are some ways businesses can benefit from addressing the problem of food waste in their organizations.

Buy less food: By minimizing unnecessary food expenditures, you can reduce your overall food budget. Commit to monitoring and track progress of the amount of food wasted each month is critical for trimming away excess spending and food inventory.

Reduce waste collection fees: Sometimes waste management services charge more for food waste. By lowering the amount of food waste heading to the landfill, you can save on your overall landfill expense. Contact your waste management to see if this applies in your area.

Contribute tax-deductible donations. Donating food to non-profit charities that benefit people with food insecurity can help reduce food waste, feed the poor, and lower your tax payment. All of these actions can be tracked and recorded in your corporate social responsibility (CSR) report each year, which communicates the non-financial value of your business. Numerous organizations are working to solve this issue.

Rotting food in landfills is a huge source of methane pollution: Rather than cycle nutrients into the soil, as in the case of compost, landfills simply trap and contain waste. On the one hand, this prevents contamination of the water supply, but on the other, it creates potent GHG emissions. Some landfills are designed to trap methane and recycle it as biogas. However, not all are technically equipped to do so. In this case, the methane is released into the atmosphere. This is a serious problem for climate change, because methane is a greenhouse gas that heats the atmosphere up to 80 times faster than carbon dioxide.

What can you do to fight against food waste?

Creative solutions to food waste await your business. But first, it takes some planning.Businesseshopingtoreducefoodwasteshouldmakeitacommitment. This means identifying the ways people waste food at your workplace and on a household level then setting goals to reduce the impact. After that, consider ways you can close the food waste loop and create value.

Here are a few strategies: Composting food waste into valuable topsoil. Donating to local food banks may benefit from food donations. Collecting the food waste and transforming it into biogas.

Partnering with a food waste start-up as a supplier is another great approach. The company Fruit leather in Rotterdam, for instance, makes vegan leather from unsold fruit. Maximizing food purchasing by only ordering what will get consumed is another way to cut back on food waste. **(safdie, 2023)**

Food Waste in India & The way forward

Indians waste as much food as the whole of United Kingdom consumes – food wastage is an alarming issue in India. Our streets and garbage bins, landfills have enough proof to prove it. Weddings, restaurants, hotels, social and family functions, households spew out so much food. According to the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), up to **40%** of the food in India is wasted. About **21** million tons of wheat is wasted in India and 50% of all food across the world meets the same fate and never reaches the needy. In fact, according to the agriculture ministry, **Rs.50,000 crore** worth of food produced is wasted every year in the country. India ranks 103 among 119 countries in Global Hunger Index **2018**. Only government policies are not responsible for the problems we are facing today, but our culture and traditions are also playing a lead role in this drama. In India, the bigger the wedding, the larger the party and the more colossal the waste.

Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare **Dr. Harsh Vardhan** has inaugurated first-ever World Food Safety Day was celebrated by Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI). He appealed to all the people of India to make 'Eat Right' movement a '**Jan Andolan'** with '**Jan Bhagidhari'** just as we all had come together and made India Polio-free. Food is everyone's responsibility-let us pledge to not waste even one grain of food and ensure that in our own personal capacities and in our institutions, contribute towards food security. This will help to eliminate poverty, hunger and malnutrition. (**safdie, 2023**)

A rough estimated figure by the Food and Agricultural Organisation (FAO) -Approximately **40% of the food produced** in India is wasted every year due to fragmented food and inefficacious supply chain system. India wastes more fruits and vegetables than the entire United Kingdom consumes and more grains than Australia produces.

Effect of Food Wastage

- 1. Wastage of 1/3rd of the world's Fertile Areas
- 2. Economic Consequences Declined GDP
- 3. Increased Carbon Footprint
- 4. Malnutrition related medical conditions and loss of lives in the country
- 5. Biodiversity Loss Decline or disappearance of Biological Diversity

Around 1% of the GDP is depleted in the form of food wastage. According to the Ministry of Agriculture (Govt. of India), Rs.50,000 crores of food produced gets wasted every year. In a country like India where approximately 23 Crore people live below the poverty line & 15% of the population goes hungry every day,1 in 4 children are malnourished and approximately 3000 die every day because of illness caused by poor diet.

India is one of the Largest Food Producers in the world and we have abundance of Food produced in the country to take care of our country's Food requirement and yet because of the fragmented and unorganized supply chain, storage & logistics gives us an absolute poor food distribution system. Roughly about \$14 billion worth of crops are wasted each year due to poor cold chain and disorganized logistics.

Government of India intervention - Although the Government of India is working on the overall betterment of Infrastructure Example, building better Roads, Introduction of GST, Faster movement on Tolls etc, subsidy to Cold Chain Logistics, but we need more than what is being done till now. There should be an extensive and comprehensive work on Introduction of Technology, More Awareness on Cold Chain Logistics and a planned investment. This would ensure that the Farmers would get a fair price of their produce and no Indian citizen would ever have to go hungry, hence helping the GDP as well. **(kamal, 2022)**

Government Initiatives: The Ministry of Food Processing Industries is concerned with formulation and implementation of the policies for the food processing industries within the overall national priorities and objectives. Several policy initiatives have been taken from time to time to promote growth of the food processing sector in the country. Some of these are:

- 1. Exempting all the processed food items from the purview of licensing under the Industries (Development and Regulation) Act, **1951**.
- 2. Automatic approval for foreign equity up to 100% for most of the processed food items excepting alcohol and beer subject to certain conditions.
- 3. 100% Foreign Direct Investment (FDI), under government approval route, for trading, including through e-commerce, in respect of food products manufactured or produced in India.
- 4. Lower Goods and Service Tax (GST) for raw and processed product; nearby 80% food products are covered in lower tax slab of **0%, 5% and 12%.**
- 5. Cold chain and food parks covered under Harmonized Master List of Infrastructure Sub-sector.
- 6. Incentivizing creation of infrastructure, expansion of processing capacity and developing technology to convert raw produce into value added products.
- 7. Setting up of a special fund of **Rs.2000 crore** in National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) to provide affordable credit for designated food parks and agro-processing units.
- 8. Government agencies such as the Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA), National Horticulture Board (NHB) were set up to help provide financial assistance and drive exports developing cold chain sector. The union agriculture ministry is working in coordination with fresh and healthy enterprises, a fully owned subsidiary of the government-owned Container Corporation of India, to launch a special purpose vehicle (SPV), a body to fund projects.

Aims and Objectives: Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) plays a key role not only in food safety and hygiene but also in ensuring availability of wholesome food and encouraging citizens to eat the right foods. Therefore, the aim of FSSAI via IFSA is primarily to:

Care: Help minimize food wastage across the supply chain by means of redistribution to poor and needy.

Aware: Mobilize people to minimize their food wastage through widespread awareness program across the country by Food Recovery Agencies.

Share: Facilitate safe distribution of surplus food by connecting trained food recovery agencies with food chains.

Prepare: Educate food business on best practices and encourage them to adopt the same in order to prevent food loss along the supply chain.

Declare: Provide strategic policy, regulatory, and programme support to food loss and waste reduction initiatives. **(Dheyas, 2003)**

FOOD WASTAGE IN TAMIL NADU

But rough estimates of Greater Chennai Corporation from pre-covid times say about **25 tonnes** of total solid waste generated in Chennai every day is cooked food. "It has reduced to less than 1 tonne a day due to closed establishments," an official with the solid waste management wing of GCC said.

About 600kg of leftovers from eateries in the city, which would otherwise be discarded, found its way to the poor and homeless in December. As part of efforts to tackle food waste and hunger in one go, 'Eat Right Chennai' initiative, part of a nation-wide campaign by the food safety department, was launched in the city on **December 9, 2020**.

Under the initiative, NGOs with tie-ups with the Food safety and standards Authority of India (FSSAI) under the Indian Food Sharing Alliance (IFSA) collect excess food from hotels and restaurants and distribute them in 'hunger spots' in the heart of the city.

Two NGOs have been engaged by the department to collect food that is left unconsumed in **30 select** hotels and restaurants every day. The Chennai chapter of no No Food Waste, one of the NGOs, collected more than **500kg** of food in the **21 days** up to **December 31**. **Around 1,500** people were fed with the food, with each individual receiving approximately **350 grams** of food. The other **100kg** was collected and redistributed by FOOD BANK-India, according to sources with the food safety department.

Dr A Ramakrishnan, officer designated to handle the programme here, said the eateries were limited to 30 for a pilot run. The NGOs involved have strict rules to comply with, he said. "Those collecting the food from the hotels and restaurants have to ensure that the dishes are at specified temperatures and must handover the food to people in sealed packets. They must also record all the details and send it to us on a monthly basis," he said. The number of serving hotels and restaurants under the network would be increased to 100 by March, he added. Explaining how it works, **R. Arun Kumar,** director of No Food Waste, Chennai Chapter, said food is collected in the evening and distributed in hunger hotspots including **Koyambedu**, Central, Marina and other areas with slum settlements. **"More eateries should join the initiative,"** he said. The NGO, which has been redistributing food this way for years, said the quantity of leftovers and calls for food pickups have reduced due to the pandemic. "There weren't many lavish weddings, business meetings were held online and people mostly worked from homes, leaving little business for hotels. We used to collect **1.5 tonnes** of food daily before the pandemic, now it is barely one-third of it," he added.

There is no existing study or survey on food that goes to waste in Chennai. But rough estimates of Greater Chennai Corporation from pre-covid times say about 25 tonnes of total solid waste generated in Chennai every day is cooked food. "It has reduced to less than 1 tonne a day due to closed establishments," an official with the solid waste management wing of GCC said. **(kabirdoss, 2021)**

Volunteers don't get paid, not because they're worthless, but because they're priceless.




SINGLE PARENT (EDUCATION)

It is not by coincidence but because of structural inequality, discrimination and bias that women are more vulnerable. The world commemorated women on **IWD 2022** under the hashtag **#BreakTheBias.**

FFAC works towards making the society an equitable, inclusive and free from bias place for women by providing them educational, economical, professional and emotional support throughout the year as part of our perennial project called Mission Pink. However during the week of women's day, we pledge to provide the special attention that the women in our society most deserve. **FFAC** salutes women for their sustainability initiatives at different levels of society. However, sometimes it is hard to look beyond survivability. We have seen the plight of women as single parents around us. Many live a life full of financial and emotional challenges filled with guilt and blame of never being able to do enough. To worsen things, a feeling of being incomplete is thrusted upon them. This year (2022), thanks to all the support we received, we were able to provide food provisions to four single mothers from **Ayanavaram**, **Tondiarpet**, and **Moolakadai** and to five widowed women based in **Thiruvallur** and **Cheyyar**. And as an effort to provide educational support to a student with single mother, FFAC made a donation of **Rs. 5000** to **SDNB Vaishnav** College for Women. Apart from these, our team had also distributed food and water to thirty poor /homeless people in **Perambur**.

A hand cart's journey to deliver financial support



It all began with **Salome,** a 42-year-old woman, who was a helpless homemaker struggling during the **covid-19 pandemic**. Her husband **Stalin**, a painter by profession had to refrain from working due to his poor heart condition. The couple has two children and the daughter was a grade 12 student when we got to know about them. The family was unable to financially manage and pay her school fee. They had reached out for support regarding the same.

When Salome's story of struggle reached **Food For All Chennai**, we paid her daughter's school fee amount of **Rs. 7,000** through the support of our kind sponsors. Salome had then expressed her need to become financially independent in order to be able to take care of her family and so requested for a handcart. She was passionate about starting a small scale business to generate revenue so that she could run her family and afford the education of her children.

FFAC understands that creating the means for economic independence is the true way of supporting women as it leads to their empowerment. We were hard-pressed on achieving this for **Salome** and sought support from our sponsors. Thanks to their kind contribution, we were able to provide **Salome** with the handcart she needed. We hoped that this would pave way to fulfil her aspirations for her family but unfortunately, Salome could not manage to continue with the food cart business.

After this when we were looking for someone who could benefit from this hand cart, we decided to give it to **Ram Kumar. Ram** and his family (wife, son and daughter) are from **Thiru Vi Ka Nagar.** He is physically challenged and his daughter is an intellectually disabled child. **FFAC** had in the past provided their family with some provisions but since this family needed more financial stability we thought the hand cart could be of help. Ram had requested us for kitchen equipment needed for running a food cart and we had provided him

with **Rs. 5,000** worth of the same. He planned to run the food cart in a spot near the corporate office in the locality but since few other food carts were already functioning in that place, Ram was asked to find another place. However due to his physical limitations, he was unable to pull the cart to farther places and expressed his honest opinion that this food cart could be put to better use if it was given to someone else.

After Ram, we met **Devi** from **Erukkanchery**. **Devi** had two children and her husband's earnings were not enough to run the family and support the kids' education. **Devi** is a self-employed woman who sold **vadas** from her house front to support her family. We respected her efforts and gave the food cart to her to help her meet her family needs better. She now runs the food cart at a junction in **Erukkanchery** and is successfully selling **vadas** in the evenings and **tiffin** varieties at night.

Salome, Ram Kumar and **Devi** had all needed something to make life better for their families and were all deserving of the hand cart but things don't always work out the way we want them to. That does not mean we don't try, it only means that we try better and harder without losing hope until they do work out.




80G TAX EXEMPTION
